This program is designed to offer a broad-based update on traditional techniques as well as new ideas in the field of orthopedic surgery.

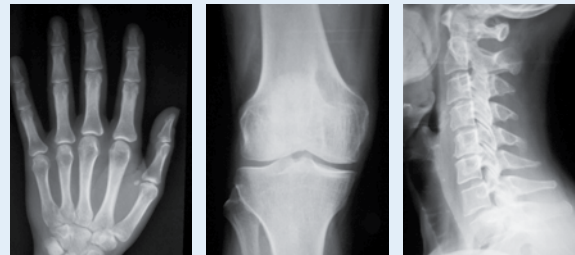
Target Audience

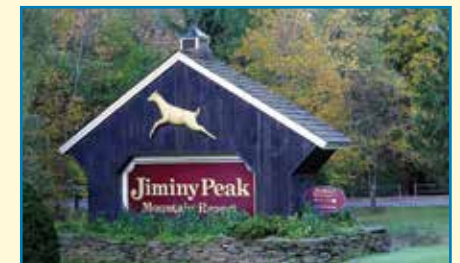
